THE WAR.

THE following List contains the names of all Old Westminsters known to be serving in H.M.'s Forces. The number of these is 1,086, of whom 76 are serving in the Navy, 934 in the Army, while 79 have given their lives for their Country. The List has been corrected to June 30, 1916, with a few subsequent additions, and it is hoped will prove an accurate and complete record to that date. There are, however, probably many Westminsters serving either with the Overseas Forces or in the ranks of whom at present we have no record. We should be grateful for the names and regiments of any of these in order that they may be included in the List.

It is hoped that at the end of the War it may be possible to publish the List in a permanent form, and to include in it biographical notes of those who have fallen, war services, classified lists of honours, &c., which, for considerations of space, it seems better for the present to omit. The distinctions may, however, be briefly noted. Seventy-five Old Westminsters have been mentioned in Despatches, and of these, Brigadier-General A. R. Hoskins has been mentioned three times and twelve others have been mentioned twice. As noted in the last edition of the List, Surgeon-Captain A. Martin Leake, V.C., was awarded a Clasp to the Victoria Cross which he won in South Africa. Other distinctions are eleven D.S.O.'s, twelve Military Crosses, four C.M.G.'s, two C.B.'s, four

Legions of Honour, and one Order of St. Vladimir. We take this opportunity of thanking all those Westminsters (past and present) and others for information and assistance in various ways, and will gladly welcome any additions or corrections to the List.
