THE WAR.

THE following List contains the names of all those Westminsters who are known to be serving in H.M.'s Forces, and has been corrected to about the middle of May. The total number is 1187, including 122 who have given their lives for their country. In accordance with a request issued by the Secretary of the War Office, it has been necessary to suppress much of the information given in the last edition of the War List (III.) in order to prevent the inadvertent disclosure of military information. It is hoped, however, that the present List may be found accurate and useful, and the Compiler will be glad at any time to give fuller information (should it be in his possession) to any Old Westminster or other who may care to write and ask about anyone in the List. He would also again appeal to past and present Westminsters to assist in making the List

more complete and accurate by sending him information, and he takes this opportunity of thanking many who have helped him by so doing since the last edition. Such corrections or additions should be sent as before to Lawrence E. Tanner, Esq., 2 Little Dean's Yard, S.W.1.

It remains to note distinctions, etc. Since the last edition Lieut.-General A. R. Hoskins, C.M.G., D.S.O., has been General Officer Commanding-in-Chief in East Africa, and Major-General R. G. Egerton has been made a Knight Commander of the Bath. The total number of distinctions awarded to O.W.W. have been :—V.C., 1 (a clasp to a V.C. won in the South African War); K.C.B., 1; K.C.S.I., 1; D.S.O., 26; M.C., 32; C.B., 3; C.M.G., 6; Legion of Honour, 4; Orders of St. Stanislaus, 2; of St. Vladimir, 1; of Karageorge, 1; of St. Anne, 1; of the White Eagle, 1; while 112 have been mentioned in Despatches, several for the second, third or fourth time.
