THE WAR.

THE following List contains the names of 930 Old Westminsters who are, or who have been, serving in H.M.'s forces. Of these 59 are serving in the Navy, 818 in the Army, while 53 have lost their lives in the service of their Country. It is a record of which we may justly feel proud, for it should be remembered that Westminster, which has thus contributed more than three times its own size, is the smallest of the great Public Schools, and that not more than about eighty Old Westminsters were in the Regular Army when war was declared.

But although the number of Westminsters who have entered the Army of late years has been small, there have not been wanting those who have upheld the great naval and military traditions of the School. Rear Admiral R. F. Phillimore, C.B., M.V.O., the son of a distinguished Westminster Admiral, commanded H.M.S. "Inflexible" in the Battle off the Falkland Isles, was commended for his services as Principal Beach Master at the great landing in the Dardanelles, and is at present serving with the Russian Fleet in the Baltic. In the Army and Marines, Major General R.G. Egerton, C.B., Brigadier General Sir G. G. Aston, K.C.B., A.D.C. (Colonel-Commandant Royal Marine

Artillery), Brigadier General N. M. Smyth, V.C., Brigadier General C. J. Markham, Brigadier General A. R. Hoskins, D.S.O., Brigadier General R. W. R. Barnes, D.S.O., Brigadier General C. L. MacNab, Bt.-Colonel C. B. Vyvyan, C.B., C.M.G., and Colonel Sir W. B. Leishman, C.B., F.R.S. (a member of the Army Medical Advisory Board), are all Old Westminsters.

Nineteen Old Westminsters have been mentioned in Despatches (some more than once) while "for most conspicuous bravery and devotion to duty throughout the campaign, especially . . . in rescuing whilst exposed to constant fire, a large number of the wounded who were lying close to the enemy's trenches," Surgeon Captain A. Martin Leake, V.C., was granted the probably unique distinction of a Clasp to the Victoria Cross which he had previously won in the South African War for a similar act of gallantry. The other distinctions won by Westminsters may be very briefly

noted—three D.S.O.'s., one C.B., one C.M.G., two Military Crosses, two Legions of Honour.

Considerable care has been taken to make the List (which is corrected to October 31st) accurate and complete. But although every name has been as far as possible verified, promotions and alterations in posting take place every day, and it is probable that no amount of time and study of Gazettes can prevent promotions being missed and errors and inaccuracies from appearing. Owing to the very great difficulty of getting reliable information it has been thought better for the present to omit the asterisk which in previous Lists denoted service at the Front. We take this opportunity of thanking all those Westminsters (past and present) and others for information and assistance in various ways and will gladly welcome any additions or corrections to the List.
